Service Officer News You Can Use

The Veterans Affairs Tennessee Valley Healthcare System (TVHS) advises Veterans to have breast cancer screening

October 21 was National Mammography Day. Women's health at Tennessee Valley Healthcare System wants female and male Veterans to know early detection is the key to treating breast cancer. TVHS recommends women Veterans to get their mammogram annually starting at age 45 through 54. In some situations, patients can schedule mammograms between ages 40

and 44. At 55, it's recommended to get screened every two years. For men, imaging is completed when there is a possible concern or lump found. Veterans can call the mammography department directly to schedule their appointment at 615-873-8335 or 615-225-4896. They are strongly encouraging every female Veteran to get a mammogram sooner than later.

New Home Loans for National Guard and Reserve Members
